

Loving Samaritans Conversation Prompts



1. How does the contrast between gated communities and urban high-rises illustrate different approaches to Christian living and mission?





6. Discuss how you believe empathy can enhance the way we interact with one another.





5. What steps can we take to bridge the gap between 'insiders' and 'outsiders' in our communities and create a more inclusive environment?




9. Can you recall a situation where you or someone you know was misjudged based on labels? How did that impact you or them?

15. How does the concept of Christian hospitality differ from contemporary understandings of hospitality, and what challenges does this pose for us today?




16. Can you share an example from your life or community where extending hospitality led to a transformative experience for both the giver and the receiver?
